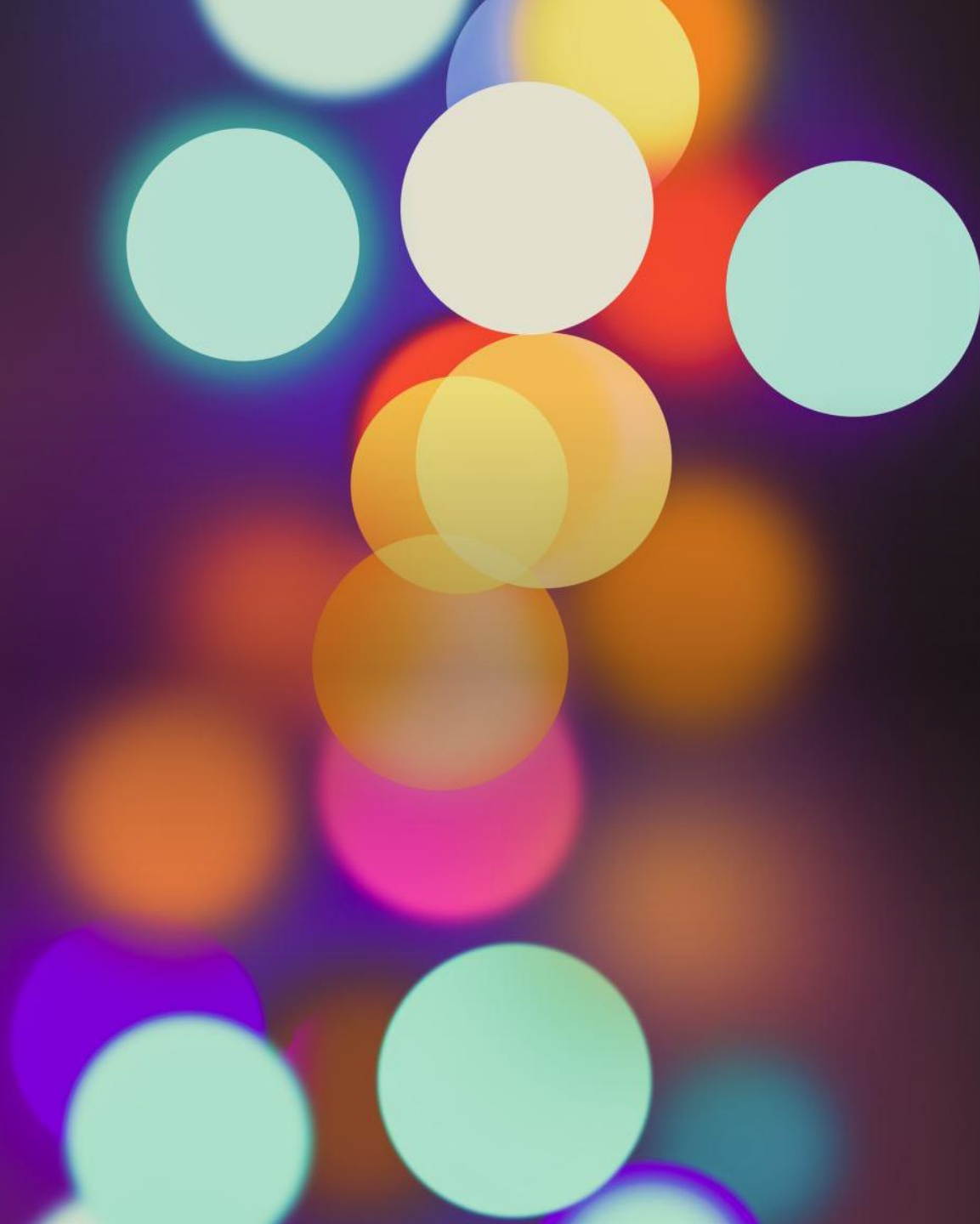

REMEMBER: .

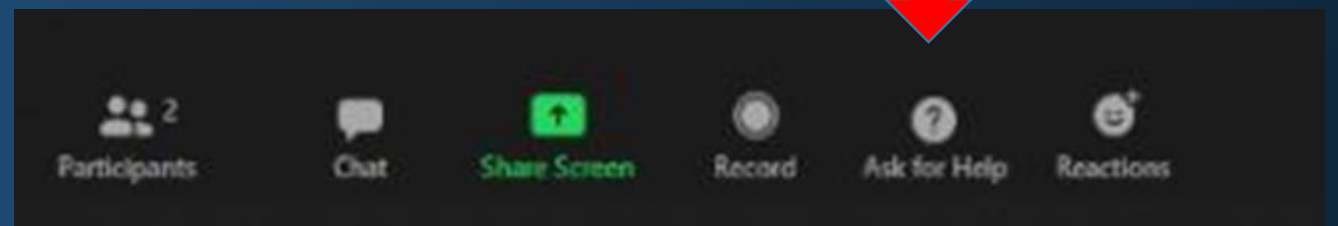
- Add your checker friend to your “friends list” so they can help you make sure you are not giving away too much information.
